## Famous artworks by Georges Seurat

Key Vocabulary	Definition
Texture	How something feels. Two types: actual (you can feel it) and visual (e.g.it looks bumpy).
Tone	How light or dark something is. Tone is also made by mixing a colour with grey or by both tinting or shading.
Pointillism technique	Developed by Seurat, it involves using small, painted dots to make areas of colour that together form a pattern or picture.
Shadow	The part of an artwork that is darkest in tone, it shows something is shaded from the light.
highlight	Part of the artwork that is the lightest tone, shows the brightest light. This is the contrast (opposite) of shadow.
