Key Vocabulary	Definition
Abstract Art	<b>Abstract Art</b> began in the United States. In its simplest form, <b>Abstract Art</b> has no subject e.g. a flower or person. It is just lines, shapes, and colours.
Abstract Expressionism	Although the <b>art</b> has no subject, it is still trying to express (show) some kind of emotion (feelings)
Optical illusion	Is when something plays tricks on your eyes. It can hurt to look at it for too long.
A Tint	Made by adding white to a colour to make it lighter.
A shade	Made by adding black to a colour to make it darker.

## Jackson Pollock

Joan Miro- Spanish artist. He produced 2,000 paintings, 500 sculptures, 400 ceramics and 1,000 lithographs.

<u>Bridget Riley</u>-English artist, one of the best known in op art, an art movement that uses optical illusions, wavy lines and black and white.

<u>Jackson Pollock-</u> American artist, famous for painting in the <u>Abstract expressionist</u> style. He splashed and dripped paint on to canvas.
