#### Rare GPCs

- Teach words with rare GPCs from ٠ the Year 5 and 6 word list (bruise, guarantee, queue, immediately, vehicle, yacht)
- Words with the /i:/ sound spelt 'ei' after 'c' (receive, ceiling)
- Words ending in '-ably' and '-ibly'
  - Revise words ending in '-able' and '-ible'
