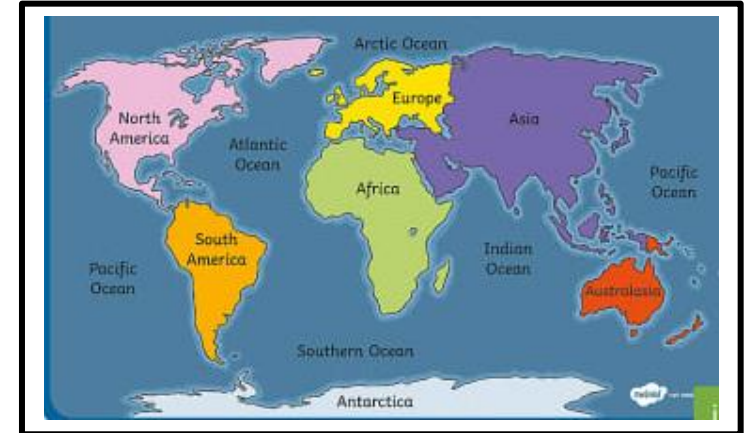
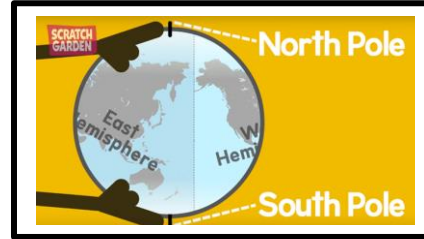

<b>world</b>	The Earth and everything on it
<b>continent</b>	A major land mass
<b>ocean</b>	A body of water that covers nearly three-quarters of the world's surface
<b>equator</b>	An invisible line that runs around the centre of the earth
<b>Poles</b>	the two opposite ends of Earth at its most northern and southern points
<b>Europe, Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Antarctica, Australasia</b>	The continents of the world
<b>Atlantic, Pacific, Indian, Southern, Arctic</b>	The five oceans of the world
<b>Climate</b>	The weather over a long period of time
