



Any child arriving after 9.00am will be recorded as an unauthorised absence. Lateness is still an issue for some children. HEALTHY FOOD IN SCHOOL SNACK TIME



Please can we remind you to only send in fruit, vegetables, or fruit cereal bars for your child's playtime snack. We will still be continuing with the Government's scheme to provide a piece of fruit or vegetable free of charge for all Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children. Unfortunately the scheme does not cover Year 3, 4, 5 or 6 children. **NO NUTS in lunch or snack boxes please due to children with allergies.**

Can we also remind you that as part of our healthy eating policy no sweets, chocolates or cakes can be given out at the end of the day by your child's teacher.

SPARE CLOTHES DONATIONS if you have any good, clean underwear, socks, tights and pants spare to donate to school, please bring into the school office or give them to your child's class teacher. If your child has borrowed spare clothes from school, please return them (cleaned!) to school. Thank you.

SUMMER TERM CLUBS - All Summer Clubs begin on Monday 29th April. Letters regarding club allocations will be sent out during the first week back. On occasions there are meetings with our local group of schools on club days which result in some being cancelled if run by teachers. This is unavoidable as they are not organised by us. All clubs are run on a voluntary basis by the adults in school and are not to be viewed as free childcare.

If your child decides that they no longer wish to attend, please let the office know, as the place can be offered to another child. Any children who miss two consecutive weeks may lose their place to another child on the waiting list. Finally, if your child's behaviour gives cause for concern in school or at the club we will revoke their place (this includes external providers as they regularly communicate at the end of their sessions).

If for any reason your child is not able to attend a club session parents must notify the office in writing, and the office staff in turn can notify the club leader not to expect that child for that session. This means we avoid any potential safeguarding issues, particularly with those KS2 children who have authorisation to walk home alone.

WARMER WEATHER — A few reminders as we hopefully approach warmer weather. It is very important that your child has a sun hat, extra drinks and sun cream with them in hot weather. There are sun creams available that last all day. Sun cream should be applied at home before school and if you feel necessary brought to school clearly labelled with your child's name and class. The sun cream must be handed over to your child's class teacher where it will be kept in the classroom. Sun cream must not be kept in children's book bags or trays as it can leak. **PLEASE NOTE THAT STAFF ARE NOT ALLOWED TO ADMINISTER SUN CREAM - YOUR CHILD SHOULD BE ABLE TO APPLY IT THEMSELVES.** Also a general reminder to ensure all items of school uniform are named clearly as in warmer weather they are often discarded on the playground!

PE & JEWELLERY - Can we remind parents / carers that children are not permitted to wear any jewellery during PE lessons as per WSCC Health and Safety Policy. The only exceptions to these regulations might be the wearing of religious or cultural jewellery, in which case your child's teacher should be consulted. The only jewellery permitted in school is a wristwatch and one pair of stud like earrings. If your child has recently or during a school holiday had their ears pierced it is up to you to provide micropore type tape for them to put on for PE lessons. It is not the responsibility of the class teacher to remove the jewellery of individual pupils.

VOLUNTEERS Knowing how valuable hearing children read on a one-to-one basis is, we would love to hear from anyone who might be able to come in to school for an hour or so (on a regular basis) each week to read with children. If you feel this is something you would like to discuss please ask at the office or come and see Miss Atkinson for an informal chat! Many thanks.



Meet the Governors Welcome to a new section of our newsletter where each Governor will introduce themselves to you. This will include a short biography and their role on the Governing Body.
