Could the Fire of London happen today?

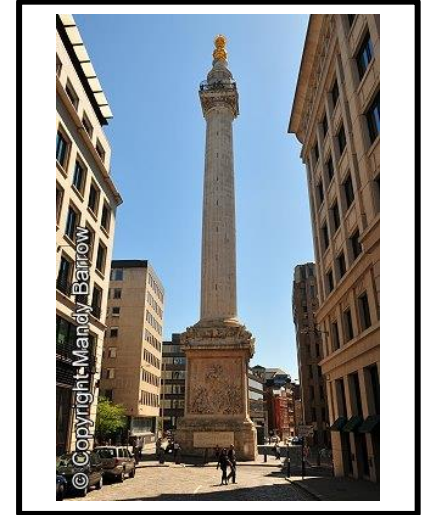
By the end of the unit I will know

cramped	Houses and properties were built closely together in the City.
flammable	Something which will easily burn.
London	The capital city of the United Kingdom.
Monument	A tall structure built to remember the victims of the fire.
Pudding Lane	Where the fire of London started.
River Thames	The river that flows through London. It was used by many people as a means of escape from the fire.
Samuel Pepys	A witness to the fire who recorded the events of September 1666 in his diary.
witness	Someone who watches or sees something as it happens.
