


# Are all Colours a Mixture of other Colours?

## Artist Study: Piet Mondrian year 1 Spring Term

<u>Key Vocabulary</u>	<u>Definition</u>
<b>Abstract art</b>	Art that is abstract does not show things that are recognisable such as people or objects. Artists use colours and shapes instead.
<b>A colour wheel</b>	Is a circular chart that shows primary and secondary colours.
<b>Primary colours</b>	The primary colours are <b>red, yellow and blue</b> . They cannot be made by mixing other colours together.
<b>Secondary colours</b>	They are made by mixing the primary colours together: yellow and red = orange    blue and yellow = green  red and blue = purple

### Piet Mondrian

- Piet Mondrian was born in 1872 in the Netherlands.
- His father was an art teacher and his uncle was an artist.
- Piet Mondrian became a primary school teacher and he painted in his spare time.
- His early paintings were mainly landscapes, featuring fields, rivers and windmills.
- Mondrian moved to Paris in 1911.
- Piet Mondrian died on 1st February 1944.
