<u>Key Vocabulary</u>	<u>Definition</u>
Landscape	The landscape is everything you can see when you look across an area of land, including hills, rivers, buildings, trees, and plants.
Acrylic paint	Acrylic paint is a fast drying paint and safer for children to use. It looks similar to oil paint.
Brush strokes	A mark made by a paintbrush drawn across a surface.
Nature	All things that are not made by people e.g. trees, weather, animals
sketches	A rough or unfinished drawing or painting, often made to help in making a more finished picture.
perspective	The direction in which a person looks at an object.

John Constable

- John Constable was born in Suffolk, England in June, 1776.
- He painted many landscapes around his home.
- He was a British landscape painter.
- His most famous work is The Hay Wain, painted in 1821 and now one of the most popular of British paintings.
- He only ever sold 20 paintings in Britain.
- He painted lots of watercolours and often included clouds in his work.
- He died in 1837 and is buried in a church in Hampstead, London.
