Why does Christmas matter to Christians? 1

What I already know

In EYFS we learned, retold and performed the Christian Christmas Story.

Christians believe in one true God and Jesus His son.

Give a clear, simple account of the story of Jesus' birth and why Jesus is important for Christians.

Concepts I need to understand

Building Blocks

Christians believe that Jesus is God and that he was born as a baby in Bethlehem.

· The Bible points out that his birth showed that he was extraordinary (for example, he is worshipped as a king, in Matthew) and that he came to bring good news (for example, to the poor, in Luke). • Christians celebrate Jesus' birth; Advent for Christians is a time of getting ready for Jesus' coming.



Challenge: Why do Christians celebrate Christmas? Do they enjoy Christmas more than those who believe differently? How will a Christian Christmas be different? What if ..?

Support – Sharing basic Christmas story picture books – sequencing using small world people, asking more closed questions - Who was Mary? What happened to her? Where was Mary when she had her baby? How do we know? Use the Bible to show them the story. Why were they visiting Bethlehem? What is a census?

Ideas for tasks

Circle time - Christmas artefact to discuss,

Role-play post office – wrapping, writing paper – lists – cards

Advent calendar – explain advent

Different versions - reading/ watching Christmas Story.

Look at viewpoints of people in the story - shepherds, Mary, Joseph, animals..

Look at Christmas art work – which are Christian, which are not Why?

Vocabulary

Nativity - The story of Jesus' birth, called the nativity, is often retold by children in **nativity** plays. ...

Christmas - is an annual festival commemorating the birth of Jesus Christ, observed primarily on December 25 as a religious and cultural celebration by billions of people around the world.

Jesus - Christians believe Jesus is the Son of God. Other Faiths see him as a prophet.

God - Christians believe there is only one true God who made heaven and Earth.

King – Jesus is born a servant King not in a palace

Advent - a time of preparation for Jesus' birth
