Design Brief: To design and make a bag

**Functional Considerations:** Your bag needs to be big enough to hold books or a small amount of shopping.

Aesthetic Considerations: It needs to look appealing to

its intended recipient.

#### Design:

#### Vocabulary:

**Template**: a shape drawn to exact shape and size to assist in cutting out.

Applique: to attach a decorative fabric item onto another piece of fabric by gluing and/or sewing.

**Design:** to generate, develop and communicate ideas for a product.

**Textile:** a type of cloth or woven fabric. **Aesthetic:** The look of the product.

Eye of a needle: the narrow opening at one end of the needle to place thread through
