


Do Portraits Always Have to Look Like a Photograph?

Artist Study: Pablo Picasso year 1 Autumn Term (2-3 lessons)

<u>Key Vocabulary</u>	<u>Definition</u>
Portrait	A painting, drawing or photograph of a person. It can be just their face or whole body.
Abstract art	A drawing or painting that does not try to copy or show what something really looks like.
Realistic art	A drawing or painting that tries to copy what something looks like.
Primary colours	They are yellow, blue and red. They are not made by mixing other colours.
Secondary colours	They are made by mixing the primary colours together: yellow and red = orange blue and yellow = green What are the secondary colors?  red and blue = purple

What I should already know

- How to draw a self-portrait.
- What the primary colours are.
- How to choose the correct brush size.
- How to make different brush strokes e.g. in a circle to look something is spinning or turning.


Famous art works

Pablo Picasso

- He was born in Spain in 1881 but lived in France for most of his life.
- His full name is 23 words long.
- He painted his first painting when he was 9 years old-a bullfighter.
- He was also a sculptor, printmaker and made things out of clay (ceramics).
- He painted pictures with shapes in them. This is called a cubist style.
- He painted thousands of paintings.
- He lived until he was 91 years old.
