- Use Digimaps to **compare** human and physical features of West Sussex **now and in the past**

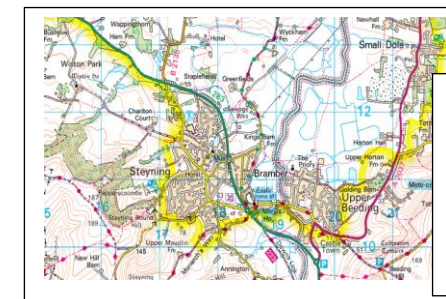
Human features of West Sussex	Physical Features of West Sussex
Worthing Chichester – the 'county' town Horsham Findon Shoreham Harbour – a small port Chichester Harbour Littlehampton Harbour	South Downs National Park Rivers Adur and Arun The Weald – between the North and South Downs Woodland – ancient woodland at Kingley Vale Coast and cliffs - Seven Sisters Country Park

farm	A place used to produce crops or livestock
harbour	A sheltered port where boats can be kept safely
landscape	Everything that you can see in a large, rural area
port	A harbour where ships load or unload goods
river	A large natural flow of water that meets the sea
sea	A large area of salty water that is part of an ocean
scale	The link between the distance on the map and the distance on the ground
town	A large group of houses, shops and buildings where people live and work – Worthing is a town
United Kingdom	Includes England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland
village	A small group of houses - few shops and people Findon is a village
