## Important Facts

- People have settled and lived in the Worthing area for over 7000 years
- Before 1800s Heene was a rural area
- Worthing and Heene developed from a fishing village to a 'fashionable' seaside resort in Victorian times
- Bathing Machines were built in 1805 and 1814
- Heene Terrace was built in 1860s (still there)
- A swimming pool was built in 1866 and demolished in 1973
- The railways arrived in 1889
- Heene was a village
- Heene School was opened in 1886
- 44 children attended paying fees of 2d to 4d
- 159 attended in 1899
- In 1974 – it became Heene First and Middle School
- In 1870 there were 194 people and 37 houses
- In 2011 7,900 people lived in Heene
- St Botolph's Church was built in 1872
- St Matthews was built in 1898
- West Worthing Station built in 1889

## What I will know by the end of the unit (Historical skills and enquiry)

- Our local area has changed over time
- That people have been in our area for a very long time and that has caused change
- Identify that a century is 100 years and people have lived in our area for many centuries
- Know what these changes look like on a timeline
- How to sequence pictures and artefacts on a Worthing timeline
- Photographs, pictures, maps and objects can tell us what Worthing was like 100 years ago
- How to compare pictures of Worthing in the past with the present
- Describe memories that people have of Worthing in the past
- Use digital maps to find out what has changed in Worthing in the last 100 years
- Be able to ask questions about change
- Make choices about sources and how helpful they are to us
