Battle	A large fight between two forces or sides
century	One hundred years.
Crimea	A part of Russia
Crimean War	A war that was fought between Britain, France, Turkey and Russia
decade	Ten years
disease	Something which attacks the body and causes sickness
evidence	Proof that something happened
excluded	To be left out
historic	An event which took place in the past and is remembered today
hygiene	Keeping clean and prevent illness eg keeping a wound clean
infection	Something which invades the body and causes illness
injure	To be seriously hurt
medicine	A drug which helps cure or prevent disease or illness
nurse	A person trained to care for the sick or very unwell
patient	Someone who is being cared for by a doctor or a nurse
photography	A way to record something in real life using a camera
soldier	A man (or a woman) who is trained to fight for their country
The Lady with the Lamp	The phrase used to refer to Florence Nightingale
to nurse	To take care of someone who is sick or very unwell
wounded	When a soldier is seriously hurt in a battle
