Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to the first newsletter of 2022 and may I start by wishing you all a very happy and healthy New Year. It has been really lovely to see most of the children back with us and I am delighted to say that the atmosphere around the school has been just delightful! I do hope you all managed to have as good a Christmas break as possible and that you are ready, alongside your children to enjoy the new term and all that it has to offer. Below you will find a short message from each of the Year Group Teams and next Friday we will be sending you home a more detailed plan of the learning the children will enjoy for the coming few weeks.

As leaders, we are anticipating being able to appoint a new Headteacher to Heene this term. We have had visits from a number of interested candidates and look forward to being able to welcome them to our school for interview later this month. We will, of course let you know if we have been successful as soon as we are able. Should we be successful in appointing a new Headteacher for Heene this month, it will mean that Mrs Sherlock and I will be able to work closely with them to support their transition to Heene before the start of the new school year in September.

A warm welcome to our new staff:

We have been extremely sad to lose a number of staff from Heene in recent weeks the departure of staff onto new careers, gives us the great opportunity to welcome new staff to Heene. We have been delighted to have been able to develop our leadership strength further at Heene with the appointment of Mr Mark Christmas who will join us at Easter as the new Key Stage 2 Leader. Mr Christmas' responsibilities will sit just below Miss Beer's and he will be responsible for leading on all matters relating to Years 3, 4, 5 and 6. We will let you know more about that nearer the time.

This term we are also very pleased indeed to have Mr Parsons and Miss Atkinson back with us, both of whom we have welcomed back warmly.

We also have new staff this term to welcome to our team.

We are pleased to welcome Ms Carnegie – who will be with us this term and has the pleasure of getting to know Stanton Class following the departure of Mrs Cannon. We also have four new Teaching Assistants to welcome to our team. Mrs Usher and Miss Ellis will be working in our Early Years and Year 1 teams and Ms Greathead and Miss Rosolek will support our children within KS2 – a very warm welcome to them all.

















Covid-19 Update:

I feel sure most parents will be aware of much of the latest guidance relating to Covid-19 restrictions, something which we have had to work with now for almost two years, which hardly seems possible. Central Government is clear in their determination to keep schools open with face to face teaching as a priority and we are therefore doing all we can to achieve that. You should have already received two emails this week from our team regarding our plan to keep classes and year groups open and how we will manage the situation if this becomes impossible at any time due to staffing or infection levels. I am delighted to say that the term has begun well with a full complement of staff and most children at school, accompanied by very low infection rates. Staff continue to wear masks in communal areas and we are making sure that any visitors to the school take Covid tests before they enter. We will continue to update these measures as required by the Department for Education.

If at any time from Monday, your child needs to self-isolate then their remote learning will be available through 'Google Classrooms'.

We would like to reiterate the new Government guidance issued regarding Lateral Flow Testing.

The new rule regarding regular lateral flow testing (LFT) comes into effect from Tuesday 11th January, this means if you are testing as a requirement of going to work/school and have NO COVID-19 symptoms, the new rule below will apply.

If your regular LFT is positive and you <u>DO NOT</u> have any symptoms there is now no requirement to have a PCR. You must however isolate for 7 days from the date of the test and take a LFT on day 6 and 7. If those tests are negative you can end your isolation period.

LFT are taken by people who do not have COVID-19 symptoms.

If however you have any COVID-19 symptoms you must isolate and get a PCR test. The Government guidance states:

Anyone who develops 1 of the 3 main COVID-19 symptoms should stay at home and self-isolate and take a PCR test. They must self-isolate if they get a positive test result, even if they have had a recent negative lateral flow test – these rules have not changed.
