

Internet safety: Year 6

Key Question: How can my privacy settings keep me safe?

What I should know already:

- I know the information I need to keep private online.
- I recognise cyber bullying and what to do if I experience it.
- I understand the importance of strong passwords.
- I know about safe e-mails and 'phishing' e-mails.
- I know how to be a good Digital Citizen.
- I know how old I should be before using different social media sites.
- I know I should only say online what I would say to someone's face.

What I will know by the end of the unit:

- I know how to keep safe on social media websites such as Facebook, Twitter and Instagram, e.g only accepting friend requests of people I know.
- \circ $\;$ I understand about privacy settings and how to set them.
- I understand that posting things on a YouTube channel means that anyone in the world can view it.
- I understand how a digital footprint is left and is nearly impossible to delete.
- I know how to use WhatsApp and other chat APPs responsibly.
- I understand that from the age of 10 I can be arrested and perhaps charged for sending explicit images and messages to other people.
- I know that if I were to be reported for sending an explicit image of myself I could be charged with production and distribution of child pornography.
- I know that if I receive an explicit photograph of someone and share it I can be prosecuted for distributing child pornography.

Key Vocabulary: See previous years key vocabulary

Social media – websites and applications that enable users to create and share content or to participate in social networking. Explicit - describing or representing sexual activity in a graphic fashion.

Possible experience/outcome:

- Watch the Jigsaw video to start off conversations.
- This unit is about being open and honest without judgement within the class and should be taught using RSHE style lessons.
- Shown exact privacy settings and how to change them on facebook, twitter, snapchat, Instagram, Whatsapp, tiktok and any other social media apps the children say they are using. If children have their phones in school and it is appropriate they could change their personal settings while in class.









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Possible modification and challenge:

Modification – Although not for the LA children but those who do disclose using different apps and forums that are not age appropriate may need quiet time away from the class to discuss this with an adult they trust.

Challenge – To be able to talk confidently about keeping safe online and the law around it.
