Key Vocabulary: See previous years key vocabulary

Filter content – content filtering is the use of a program to screen and exclude from access or availability webpages or e-mail that is deemed objectionable or unsuitable such as our school server blocking certain websites.

Virus – a computer virus is a malicious software program loaded onto a computer without the user knowing. These can "infect" other programs on your computer.

Spyware – software that can collect your private data without you knowing.

Good Digital Citizen – means you are part of the group of people that use technology to communicate. There are rules that you need to follow to protect yourself and others.
