Dear Parents and Carers,

They have worked their way through a challenging and very different final year at school and we are so sorry that we cannot give them the send-off we would love to have given them. We are going to do all we can to make this final week at Heene very special to them and will certainly wish them every success as they take the next step along their journey; they are a fabulous Year Group and we will miss them very much!

Plans for September: We are working hard to continue to develop our plans for September. We are hoping that school life will be a little more 'normal' in September so that we can return to many of the things that makes life at Heene more community focused, enjoyable and unrestricted.

We are beginning to put our school clubs offer together and are looking to offer these each day of the week. We are planning to return to whole school Collective Worship which is such an important feature of what Heene is all about and we are looking forward to sharing with you and the children, our brand new curriculum ready for the new academic year. As I have said before, there are exciting times ahead. Moving forward, each week we will let you know what your children will be learning and giving you ideas as to how you can support them with their learning or prepare them for new learning that they are about to meet. We want to work increasingly in partnership with you and want you to see a difference when we return in September.

Higher expectations for all: I have already mentioned that we are going to be raising the expectations for all our children, staff and parents at Heene in September. These will cover a number of different areas, a few of which I have listed below.

- 1) 'We all behave well at Heene': Good behaviour is key to children being able to learn and we are putting plans in place to ensure that behaviour at Heene quickly becomes and outstanding feature of our school. We are going to do this by introducing some very simple 'Golden Rules' which all adults and children can follow and agree to. They will be simple in wording and clear to understand by all children in all year groups and directly linked to our key school values. As soon as these have been finalised we will let you see them so that you will be able to support this new initiative with your children at home, for which we thank you.
- 2) 'We all look smart at Heene': I have already indicated that as well as the children behaving exceptionally well in September, we are looking for them to be very smart too in presentation. Please could I ask you to look at the uniform expectations on our website, particularly the differences in KS1 and KS2. We are asking that children in KS2 wear shirts and ties and that children in KS1 wear polo shirts without ties. We are also expecting the children to be smartly dressed for PE too please do see the website for real clarity on this. Please don't send your children in with their home clothes for PE. We would ask you to ensure that for September the children are dressed in the correct uniform. Thank you so much for your active support with this.

- 3) 'We all work hard at Heene': We are looking forward to teaching the children from a brand new curriculum in September, which we hope will offer them increased interest, challenge and motivation to do well. We will support them every step of the way to achieve what we are going to be asking of them and will aim to keep you informed every step of the way too.
- 4) 'We all come to Heene every day and every day on time': We are looking to all parents to make sure that all of the children arrive at school on time, every day. We need this so that the children can access the maximum amount of learning time possible. We are going to continue to support parents as much as we can with achieving this, but our expectations of the children to be on time to school and attend every day will be very high and we will need your positive support to achieve this. Thank you in advance for the efforts we know you will make here.

More information about all of these expectations will come to you in our final Newsletter of term, next Friday, so that consideration can be given to them all over the summer break – we are excited for the future!
