Topic: Incarnation / What is the Trinity? Year Group: 4

What I should already know.

Creation story in Genesis – story of the beginning of the world. **Salvation at Easter**, Jesus suffered, died and rose again – **Resurrection Nativity Story /Christmas** – Jesus birth -the main events and people involved in the story and the sequence that they happened in. What it is like to welcome and prepare for a new baby.

Jesus is a servant king as opposed to a warrior king. Jesus'/ Gods' love is for everybody. God seen as a Father figure in Gospels- eg Lost Son. Bible contains the Incarnation story in the New Testament.

Advent is a time for preparation for Jesus birth.

That the **Holy Trinity** is Father, Son and Holy Spirit – Three in One **Baptism** – John the Baptist baptised Jesus and all who came to him in reparation for Jesus.

Vocabulary:

Incarnation - central Christian doctrine that God became flesh, that God assumed a human nature and became a man in the form of Jesus Christ, the Son of God and the second person of the Trinity. Christ was truly God and truly man. Holy Trinity - The idea that God can be experienced as three person in one – Godhead. God the Father, God the Son – Jesus, God the Holy Spirit (see Below). Gospel - good story

Baptism - The Christian life is based on baptism. It is "the gateway to life in the Spirit" and "signifies and actually brings about the birth of water and the Spirit"

Salvation - (also called deliverance or redemption) is the "saving [of] human beings from sin and its consequences, which include death and separation from God" by Christ's death and resurrection, and the justification following this salvation.

Resurrection - dead coming back to life. Christians believe life has triumphed over death, good over evil, hope over despair through Jesus resurrection.
